Employment opportunities for Professional Photography graduates exist in design firms, with advertising agencies, and multimedia production companies. Many photographers are self-employed, independent artists. Individuals with a larger repertoire of technical skills and artistic ability have the greatest potential for securing employment. According to the California Employment Development Department's Labor Market Information data for San Jose-Sunnyvale-Santa Clara MSA, there are projected to be 27 combined annual openings for photographer and photographic processors for the period 2006-2016. However, the size of the labor market for photographers and digital imaging artists is considerably larger for the adjacent San Francisco-San Mateo-Redwood City MSA, with projections of 42 openings annually. The statewide occupational outlook for photographers for the period 2008-2018 is 350 annual openings and a growth rate of 7.1%. It should also be noted that the actual number of employment opportinities for individuals in the photography and digital imaging sectors is not fully captured by labor market projections as professions that include many self-employed individuals are not easily surveyed.

Impact:	Continued technological development in the medium equipment and software. Although the medium has undergone major technological change, the essence of the medium, as a print image and visual language, remains. Our enrollment management and continued programming will address any shifts, but we do not foresee major adjustments other than the continual growth and incorporation of technology; it should be noted we have done this exceptionally well. We continue to have one of the best equipped facilities for the study of photography in the Bay Area.
Explanation:	Our curriculum has changed and grown over the past ten years as digital has become a major part of the medium. We have stayed current with film-to-digital equipment and both Photoshop and now Lightroom software; all has been addressed in course curricula. The medium has maintained traditional (wet darkroom) procedures as well as incorporating major digital methods. We are fully functioning with the use of both traditional and digital methods as seen at other CC, CSU and UC campuses.
