Advising	x	Explain: Advising services include developing and modifying academic success strategies such as learning strategies, study skills, promoting self-advocacy, and learning how to approach and work with an instructor. Advising also includes developing education plans, registration assistance, and advocating for students with instructors, working with the counseling department to provide accurate counseling information concerning transfer, certificates, and AA/AS degrees. In addition, advisement also includes determining eligibility for services and accommodation (assessment program/process and review of appropriate documentation).
Orientation	x	Explain: Orientation meetings are scheduled and held throughout the year to provide information and support a smooth transition for new current students with learning disabilities.
Outreach	x	Explain: The EDC staff is invited to and attends various external and internal outreach events for students with disabilities throughout the school year. These events include high school transition fairs, workshops, and meetings, as well as campus wide events. The EDC staff also attends student services programs and instructional department meetings to encourage and support student referrals and to train staff on how to work with students with disabilities.
Registration	x	Explain: Registration assistance is a service that is offered to all eligible students with learning disabilities.
