Course Description:

This course provides students with an introduction to the potential and pitfalls of entrepreneurship. Students will learn about the various methods for starting up, managing and financing a new venture. Students will get a chance to evaluate real world business plans and videos of entrepreneurs. This course will help develop entrepreneurial thinking and examine management skills needed in business.

Student Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Examine the steps required, the support available, and the tactics commonly employed by entrepreneurs starting a business.
- 2. Critically evaluate business plans in terms of feasibility, investment potential, risk, and completeness.

Course Requirements:

Reading: Each week, you will have approximately two chapters to master. You should read the assigned text chapter, complete the assignment, and then submit a post in the chapter discussion forum. You can print out the lecture slides and use them as the study guide for the chapters.

Individual and Group Assignments (155 Points): You will be expected to answer questions in chapter assignments. The assignments are varied; they involve tasks such as pre-course surveys, self-assessments, web research, video case studies, a team problem, conducting interviews, roleplay exercises, and course evaluation. Points earned in the assignments will be evaluated according to the Assignment Rubric provided. All requirements, such as due date and times, as well as minimum word count requirements, must be met to earn points. A rubric is posted in Canvas.

Late Assignment Policy: Assignments are expected to be completed by the due date and feedback will be given within seven business days of the assignment due date. Late assignments will be accepted only if you have sought prior permission from the instructor and you have a genuine reason for the delay in submission (going on a holiday is not a valid reason). Late assignments turned in without any prior notification within four days of the due date will be graded, but a 5% penalty per day will apply to any late assignment. Assignments submitted four days after the due date will not be accepted. Group assignments have to be submitted on time, and no late submissions will be accepted.

Chapter Discussion Forums (115 Points): Each week, you will also be expected to contribute to and participate in chapter discussions. These discussion forums allow you to demonstrate your understanding of course concepts and learn from the experiences of your classmates. Points earned in the discussion forum will be evaluated according to the Discussion Rubric posted in Canvas. You have to also post a reply to at least another student by clicking on their post. (Note: The instructor is looking for quality AND quantity.)

Quizzes (130 points): There will be five equally weighted quizzes spaced evenly throughout the quarter. Each one will cover material in the assigned reading. These quizzes may include, but are not limited to, multiple choice, matching, True/False, short, and medium answer questions. Of the 5 quizzes, 4 will count, and your lowest quiz score will be dropped. There will be no make-up for a missed quiz.

Final Exam: (100 Points): The final exam will cover all chapters covered during the course.

Extra Credit: You will have opportunities to earn extra credits. Details will be posted in Canvas.

You have to dedicate time to study and complete assignments. Review each due date and schedule your work so you do not miss any activity or the deadline.

- In your chapter discussion forums, participate early. If you wait too long you may not have anything unique to add and you will have the pressure of reading a lot of posts and coming up with something "new".
- Set aside a good workspace that is quiet, has a good internet connection and is free of outside interferences.
- Studying online does not have be done in isolation. Feel free to contact me if you need clarification about any activity, need more information, if you need any help you can connect with me through Canvas Inbox, come to my office hour (no appointment needed) or make an appointment to meet at another time.
